Polling Notice - General Election

Notice is hereby given to eligible voters of the Saugeen First Nation #29 Indian Band that a General Election poll will be held Friday August 28, 2026, to elect one (1) Chief and nine (9) Councillors of the Band, and that such poll will be open from nine (9:00) o'clock a.m. local time until eight (8:00) o'clock p.m. local time at the **James Mason Memorial Cultural/Recreation Centre**. I will count the votes that same day, Friday August 28, 2026, at the same location immediately after the close of the poll and declare the results of the election.

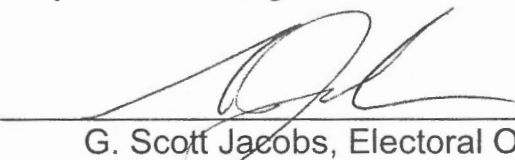
All members of Saugeen First Nation #29, whether they are living on-reserve or off-reserve, who are eighteen (18) years of age or older on Friday the 28th day of August, 2026 are eligible voters and may cast a ballot in person or by mail-in.

Eligible voters living off-reserve, for whom a last-known address is made available to the Electoral Officer by the Saugeen First Nation #29, shall be sent a mail-in ballot package.

Eligible voters living on-reserve, who for any reason choose not to attend the poll or who are unable to attend the poll in person on Friday August 28, 2026, may contact the Electoral Officer to receive a mail-in ballot after July 24, 2026.

Eligible voters who receive or pick up a mail-in ballot package may attend the poll and vote in person but, in doing so, shall forfeit the count of their mail-in ballot.

Community Connections, Collective Healing

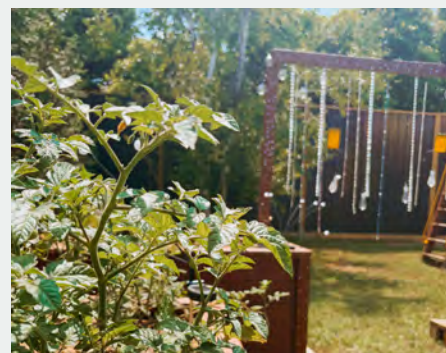

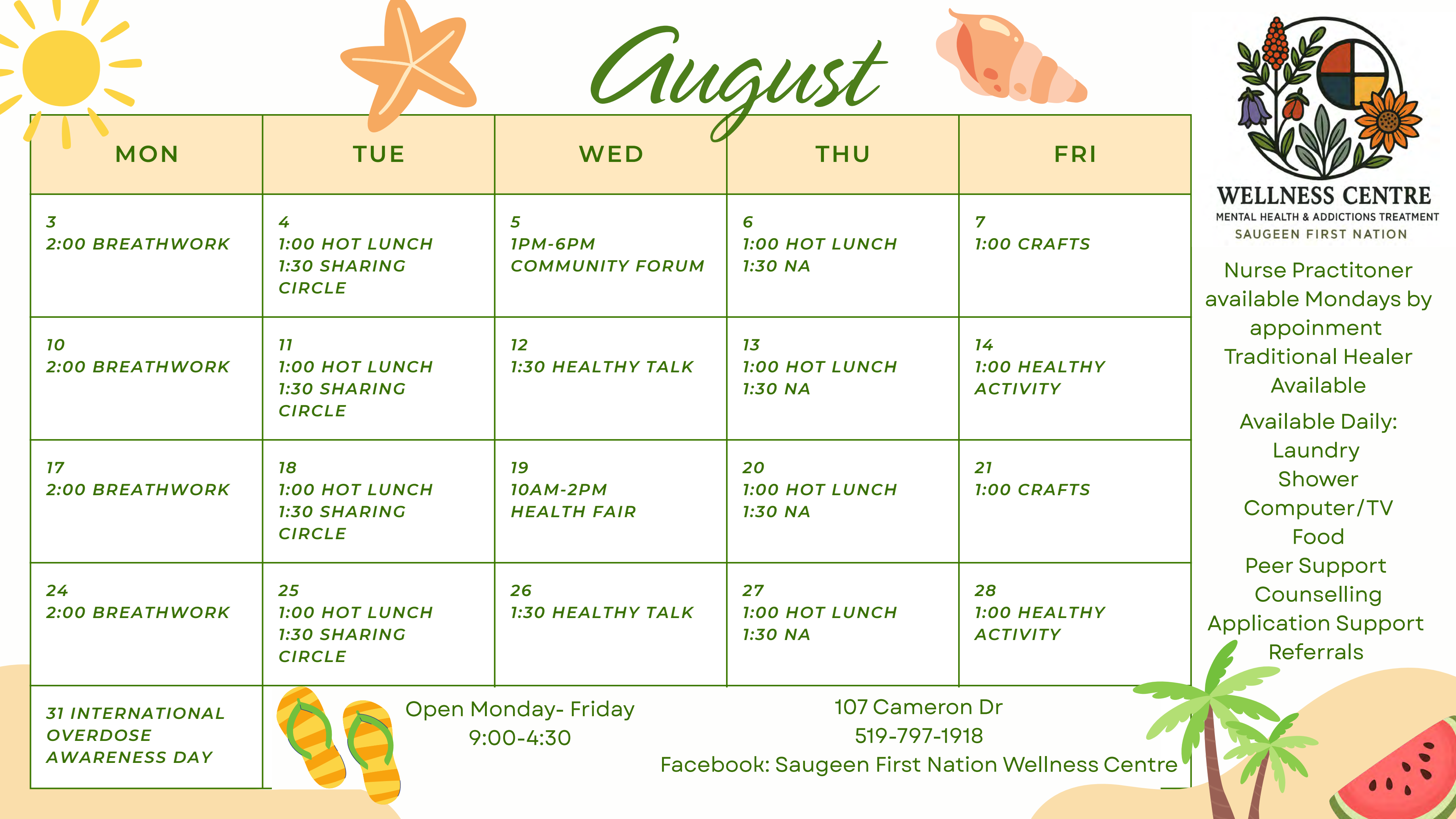

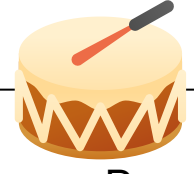

Coming Soon! New Beach Access Gates

As part of our on-going efforts to control vehicle access on the South end of Saugeen Beach, our Administration will be installing gates with vehicle license plate readers at the French Bay Rd. and the 16th St. access points. All Band vehicles, Band Member vehicles, and cottage leasees who only have driveways on the beach, will be provided with beach access. **This does not mean that we are restricting Band member access to any parts of the beach, but rather we are ensuring that a portion of the beach is always accessible to just our community.**

There will be gate workers on site to provide access to the beach at this time, they will also be there to verify your Band Status number and your vehicle license plate so we can register your vehicle into the new system. Once you are registered, you will be provided automatic entrance going forward.

There will be a special SOS Emergency Opener feature that recognizes the horn of an emergency vehicle. If you hear these vehicles, kindly move aside so they can get to their destination as quickly as possible.

The public parking lots can be found near the Main St. area. Please watch for signs. Band members are welcomed to park in these areas, but they require parking fees to be paid via credit card on the mobile app, Passport Inc.

To sign up for access

Please visit the reception desk at the Band Office. You will be required to show your Saugeen First Nation#29 Status Card as well as provide your vehicles license plate number.

We also have Visitor Access Cards, but may require a fee.

A concise overview of what Employment Development Officers (EDOs) typically do in Owen Sound, Ontario at the Huronia Area Aboriginal Management Board (HAAMB) office. Roles can vary by program and employer (e.g., provincial services, municipal programs, or non-profits), but common duties include:

- ◆ Job matching and career guidance: Help job seekers identify strengths, set goals and find suitable employment opportunities.
- ◆ Assess client needs and create tailored action plans, including skill development and training referrals.
- ◆ Provide resume, cover letter, and interview preparation support.
- ◆ Help clients interpret job postings and understand sector-specific requirements.
- ◆ Training and skill development referrals: Connect clients with relevant training programs (e.g., literacy/numeracy, trades, certifications, digital skills).
- ◆ Coordinate funding or subsidies where available (e.g., wage subsidies, training allowances).
- ◆ Facilitate on-the-job training, internships, or apprenticeships.
- ◆ Support for special populations: Provide targeted assistance to youth, newcomers, Indigenous peoples, persons with disabilities, those facing barriers to employment, and others.
- ◆ Offer language support or referrals as needed.
- ◆ Document and compliance: Help clients complete required forms for unemployment benefits, training subsidies, or program participation.
- ◆ Track progress and provide ongoing case management.
- ◆ Advocacy and navigation: Help clients understand program options, eligibility and the steps to access benefits or services.
- ◆ Coordinate with partner services (e.g., housing, health, mental health supports) when needed.
- ◆ Work search workshops and group sessions: Lead or participate in group activities on job search strategies, interview skills, and employment standards.

Background & Purpose

The Office of Indigenous Wellness, Reconciliation and Partnerships (OIWRP) was established in 2023 to support Unity Health in its efforts to advance Indigenous health and reconciliation. The office and its staff, provide a range of programs, services and supports for patients and staff.

The Indigenous Wellness Program supports self-identified Indigenous patients and their loved ones.

The OIWRP plays a critical role in supporting the organization in building better relations with Indigenous peoples and communities. It supports those who work at Unity Health to gain a better understanding of the principles of cultural safety and to learn how everyone can make a difference in providing culturally safer experiences in the care environment.

Services

- Access to smudging and traditional medicines, ceremonial bundles and ceremony
- Provide consultation, health care navigation and supports for patients, family, caregivers and advocates
- Wholistic health needs assessment to identify unmet needs
- Support with cultural and language interpretation
- Knowledge exchange between clinical staff, patients and family
- On-going educational workshops for patients and Unity Health staff, credentialed providers, volunteers and learners.
- Creating safe and well supported discharge plans and family support
- Support for the provision of culturally safer care
- Outreach to homeless people, seniors, Elders facilitated by the Family Health Team
- Relationship building with community and community-organizations
- Reducing barriers for Indigenous patients' access to care through facilitation of internal pathways
- Providing connections to community resources and supports for patients and families
